

2026 PNW Diver Symposium – FUN DIVE INFO!

- **Sund Rock (<https://sundrock.com/>)**
- **Tuesday January 13th**
- **Meet here at 12pm for check-in and dive card purchase here (<https://maps.app.goo.gl/9RJRHpCH9MA1BSrW8>)**
- **Splash time begins ~1pm, sunset is at 4:47pm**
- **Bring all your own dive gear including tanks/weights. Local dive shop is 5 minutes away in Hood sport ([YSS Dive](#))**

Access to the Sund Rock conservation area is on private property owned by a local family. We are registered as a group, but each diver will need to purchase their own dive card for \$25/diver. Parking is available at the waterfront beach access but limited to ~12 vehicles. There is overflow parking ~0.1 mile up the hill from beach access. Please carpool to reduce parking stress! There is one large porta-potty on site, but otherwise no shelter or fresh water.

Diving at Sund Rock is well known for the abundant marine life, rocky reef walls, easy sea conditions, and easy shore entry access near a large diver gear up bench. There is a short surface/bottom swim to find the reef at 30-80ft deep with more structure and sea whips going even deeper. There is also a small shipwreck at 50ft that can be reached with a longer swim. Wolf eels, giant pacific octopus, enormous Lingcod, and schooling rockfish are very common. Sunflower sea stars have been present recently. Even sixgill sharks can make an appearance if you're lucky. Visibility in the winter is usually excellent (30-50ft), but it can be very dark if the surface layer is murky, so bring a good light. Currents will be light or undetectable during the high tide and ebb on this day. The shoreline is well protected from southerly winter winds but can be exposed to northerlies.
